Prof. Yi Tang, MD, PhD is a Chief Neurologist and Professor in neurology for the Department of Neurology, Innovation Center for Neurological Disorders at XuanWu Hospital, Capital Medical University, Beijing, China.

After graduating from Peking Union Medical College with MD and PhD in 2006, he completed his residency in neurology at Xuanwu Hospital. Continuing his education overseas, he accepted a post-doctoral fellowship at Weill Cornell Medical College/New York Presbyterian Hospital. Currently Prof. Tang serves as the Deputy Director for the Key Laboratory Neurodegenerative Diseases for the Ministry of Education in China.
