Dr. Zhexing Wen is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at Emory University.

He obtained his doctor degree from the Rutgers University in 2008 and his postdoctoral training at the Johns Hopkins University in 2015. He joined the faculty of Emory University in June 2016 and created the Laboratory of Engineered Human Brain Models of Disease. He has received Molecular Psychiatry Association Young Investigator Travel Awards (2014), Johns Hopkins Helen B. Taussig Young Investigators Award (2015), NIH NCATS Director's Award (2017), Edward Mallinckrodt, Jr. Foundation Grant Award (2017), Marcus Center for Therapeutic Cell Characterization and Manufacturing Grant Award (2017), Emory IMAGINE, INNOVATE, AND IMPACT Research Award (2019), and Emory Researcher Appreciation Day Recognition Award (2020).

Prof. Wen has published 50 SCI papers with more than 6000 citations and an H index of 28 and is a coordinator and a principal leader of more than 20 research and collaborative projects.

Prof. Zhexing Wen's current research fields include neurodegenerative diseases and neuropsychiatric disorders.
